Economic Impact

The economic impact of a research-intensive university is unlike any other organization. Through increased income resulting from education, the impact of UBC research, and spending by the university, students and visitors, UBC is associated with approximately \$10 billion of spending in the BC economy. UBC produces all of BC's dentists, physical therapists, pharmacists, midwives and almost three quarters of BC-trained engineers. Through the Distributed Medical Program, UBC is also the lead partner institution educating BC-trained doctors.

Community Connections

In addition, UBC supports numerous local outreach programs and research projects in such areas as public health, sustainable development, legal aid, education, and other community services.

Island Medical Program Hosted at UVIC

UBC is proud to partner with the University of Victoria to deliver the Island Medical Program (IMP). Based at UVIC, the program is educating doctors on Vancouver Island in collaboration the Government of BC and regional health authorities. IMP is one of the province-wide distributed medical education programs launched by UBC's Faculty of Medicine and partners to create new opportunities for medical education across BC. BC History Digitization Project (BCHDP)

UBC's Irving K. Barber Learning Centre aids access to BC's historical resources by providing up to \$200,000 annually to undertake digitization projects that result in free online access to unique provincial historical material. With BCHDP funding, UVic Libraries are digitizing the dispatches sent by the governors of the Colonies of Vancouver Island and BC to the Colonial Office in London.
