Economic Impact

The economic impact of a research-intensive university is unlike any other organization. Through increased income resulting from education, the impact of UBC research, and spending by the university, students and visitors, UBC is associated with approximately \$10 billion of spending in the BC economy. In 2007/2008 alone, UBC secured \$469 million in research funding from government, industry and non-profit sources.

Studying Tree Mortality in Local Ancient Forests

For 17 years UBC biogeography professor Lori Daniels has studied seven plots of ancient forest in the Capilano and Seymour watersheds and has recently discovered that the trees she is monitoring are dying at twice the rate since she started studying them. Her research is now part of a comprehensive study of forests across western North American linking an increase in tree mortality to climate change.
